

## MATERIAL

Bracelet, 8.3 inch (21 cm) without clasp

- 117 Firepolished round beads, 4 mm, Etched Labrador
  - 168 Round beads, 2 mm, Labrador full or California Gold Rush
  - < 1 g Miyuki seed beads 15/0, Labrador full or #4201 Duracoat Gold
  - 1 Magnet clasp
  - 2 Jump rings
- Needle size 12, FireLine 6 lb smoke, flat nose pliers and scissors

### New coating: Etched beads



A special vintage look with our popular metallic coatings on 4mm Fire Polished beads, tempting mixture of shiny and matted beads.



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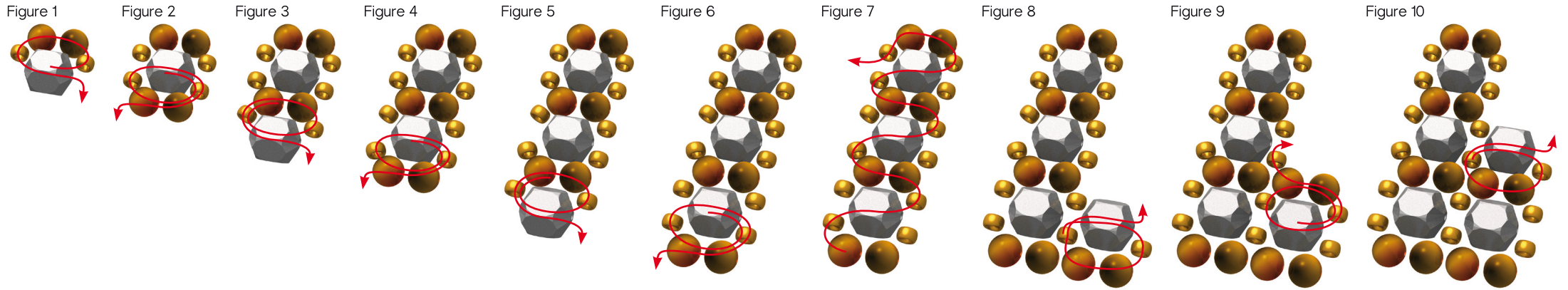

The technique used is right angle weave (RAW) and because of the different beads you get this special result.

**Figure 1** Pick up 1x firepolished round bead (FP), 1x 15/0 seed bead (15/0), 2x round beads (RB) and 1x 15/0 and stitch through the FP so you get a circle.

**Figure 2** Pick up 1x 15/0, 2x RB and 1x 15/0 and stitch through the FP and forward through the first added 15/0 and the two RB.

**Figure 3** Pick up 1x 15/0, 1x FP and 1x 15/0 and stitch through the two RB and forward through the new added 15/0 and FP.

**Figure 4** Pick up 1x 15/0, 2x RB and 1x 15/0 and stitch through the FP and forward through the first added 15/0 and the two RB.

**Figure 5** Pick up 1x 15/0, 1x FP and 1x 15/0 and stitch through the two RB and forward through the new added 15/0 and FP.

**Figure 6** Pick up 1x 15/0, 2x RB and 1x 15/0 and stitch through the FP and forward through the first added 15/0 and the two RB.

Your first row is done, this is the final width of your bracelet.

**Figure 7** To reinforce and straighten out the units you should stitch back in zig zag. Do this after every row.

**Figure 8** Turn your Bracelet and pick up 1x FP, 1x 15/0 and 2x RB. Stitch through the 15/0 and the FP.

**Figure 9** Pick up 1x 15/0 and 2x RB and stitch through the 15/0 and FP and forward through the 15/0, two RB and 15/0.

**Figure 10** Pick up 1x FP and 1x 15/0 and stitch through the two RB, 15/0 and FP.

Repeat the steps till your bracelet got the desired length (in the bracelet shown there are 39 rows).

If you got a clasp matching the width of the bracelet you can sew it on directly (of course with a new thread). Otherwise you can bead a loop as following.

**Figure 11** With your needle coming out of the bead marked with a green dot, pick up 6x RB and stitch through the first added RB to get a circle. \* Stitch forward through the next RB, pick up 1x 15/0 and repeat from \* three more times. Stitch through the next two RB and through the 15/0 of the bracelet. Repeat on the other end.

**Finishing** Sew in all threads and cut them off; attach your magnetic clasp with the jump rings.
